Lithium metal batteries installed in a device can be transported as checked or carry-on baggage. Lithium metal batteries not installed in a device (spares) are only permitted as carry-on baggage.

No, lithium-ion batteries (including power tool batteries) are prohibited in checked luggage due to fire hazards. Always pack batteries in your carry-on bag to comply with TSA and ...
