Windmills for electricity use wind energy to generate clean, renewable power. These wind turbines convert kinetic energy into electrical energy, reducing carbon emissions and dependence on fossil fuels.

Wind turbines, also known as electric windmills, convert wind into electricity using aerodynamic blades connected to a rotor. When wind hits the blades, the rotor spins and turns a generator via a gearbox.

Today, wind power is generated almost completely using wind turbines, generally grouped into wind farms and connected to the electrical grid.

Wind turbines use blades to collect the wind's kinetic energy. Wind flows over the blades creating lift (similar to the effect on airplane wings), which causes the blades to turn.

Approximately 2% of solar energy striking Earth's surface is converted into kinetic energy in wind. 1 Wind turbines convert this kinetic energy to electricity without emissions, 1 and can be built onshore or offshore. 2 ...
